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Subject: CPAC Land use designation for Wailea Sub Area 4

It is very important to those who live in Maui County that their voices be heard and considered.

For several reasons, testifiers for the preservation of open land in these areas did not work. So their voices were not able to be heard. The "bluejeans" link for online testifiers failed to work, so many voices were unable to connect. Many of the CPAC members did not attend.

Maui is developing so fast and they have wonderful and important historical and ecological sites that deserve protection. The 23 acre parcel next to Wailea Dog Park which many are already using as a park has many important sites and it is a "dryland forest". Dryland forests are fast disappearing and the construction will destroy these sites forever. Drainage problems will be worse. Maui meadows has 800 residents and no real parks. The open space would be a short walk from Maui Meadows and should be named for the ahupua'a it is in, Paeahu.

A 20 acre Cultural Preserve on Ledcor Lot 130. The current proposal to build hundreds of luxury second homes, unavailable for low income working families should not be allowed to erase Hawaiian history & culture which is too often the inevitable outcome.

I do not live on Maui, but I feel the Hawaiian people and low to no income people at least should have their long history which resides in these areas protected. Luxury condos do not care about anything besides profit and this is a great shame for the United States in a formerly sovereign nation taken without the consent of the people and terribly misused.

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
